Independent auditor's report

To the shareholders of EMF Tankers XV ApS under frivillig likvidation

Opinion

We have audited the annual accounts of EMF Tankers XV ApS under frivillig likvidation for the financial year 1 January to 14 October 2020, which comprise accounting policies, profit and loss account, balance sheet and notes. The annual accounts are prepared in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

In our opinion, the annual accounts give a true and fair view of the company's assets, liabilities and financial position at 14 October 2020 and of the results of the company's operations for the financial year 1 January to 14 October 2020 in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with international standards on auditing and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark. Our responsibilities under those standards and requirements are further described in the below section "Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the annual accounts". We are independent of the company in accordance with international ethics standards for accountants (IESBA's Code of Ethics) and the additional requirements applicable in Denmark, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these standards and requirements. We believe that the audit evidence obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Liquidator's responsibilities for the annual accounts

The liquidator is responsible for the preparation of annual accounts that give a true and fair view in accordance with the Danish Financial Statements Act. The liquidator is also responsible for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of annual accounts that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the annual accounts

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the annual accounts as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report including an opinion. Liquidator commentary

The principal activities of the company

The company's purpose is to invest directly and indirectly, as well as carrying on other activities that are naturally related to shipping.

Development in activities and financial matters

The results from ordinary activities after tax are TDKK 16.326 against TDKK -1.473 last year. The management consider the results satisfactory.

The company's associated enterprise has sold their vessel to unaffiliated third parties. The sale was successfully concluded and the vessel was delivered to new buyers.

Accounting policies

The most significant modifications caused by the liquidation

Assets and liabilities are measured at realisable values. As a result of the liquidation, all assets are recognised under current assets, whereas all liabilities are recognised as short-term liabilities.

Except from the changes mentioned above, the accounting policies used are unchanged compared to last year.

Translation of foreign currency

Transactions in foreign currency are translated by using the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the transaction. Differences in the rate of exchange arising between the rate at the date of transaction and the rate at the date of payment are recognised in the profit and loss account as an item under net financials.

Debtors, creditors, and other monetary items in foreign currency are translated by using the closing rate. The difference between the closing rate and the rate at the time of the occurrence or the recognition in the latest annual accounts of the amount owed or the liability is recognised in the profit and loss account under financial income and expenses.

Income statement

Gross loss

Gross loss comprises external costs.

Other external costs comprise costs for administration.

Net financials

Net financials comprise interest, realised and unrealised capital gains and losses concerning financial assets and liabilities, amortisation of financial assets and liabilities, additions and reimbursements under the Danish tax prepayment scheme, etc. Financial income and expenses are recognised in the profit and loss account with the amounts that concerns the financial year.

Dividend from equity investments in associates is recognised in the financial year where the dividend is declared

Tax of the results for the year

The tax for the year comprises the current tax for the year and the changes in deferred tax, and it is recognised in the profit and loss account with the share referring to the results for the year and directly in the equity with the share referring to entries directly on the equity.

The company is subject to the Danish legislation concerning compulsory joint taxation with the Danish group enterprises.

Accounting policies

The current Danish corporate tax is allocated among the jointly taxed companies in proportion to their respective taxable income (full allocation with reimbursement of tax losses).

Financial fixed assets

Equity investments in associates

Equity investments in associates are measured at cost. If the recoverable amount is lower than the cost, writedown for impairment is done to match this lower value.

Available funds

Available funds comprise cash at bank and in hand.

Equity

Dividend

Dividend expected to be distributed for the year is recognised as a separate item under equity. Proposed dividend is recognised as a liability at the time of approval by the annual general meeting (time of declaration).

Liabilities

Other liabilities are measured at amortised cost which usually corresponds to the nominal value.
